



CDETNO encourages the entrepreneurial spirit in the Northwest Territories and helps Northerners who wish to start, consolidate or develop a business project.

•Support to **33** French-speaking entrepreneurs to start or expand their business.

*Updated the French version of the Conference Planner Guide, a directory aimed at planning business trips to the NWT.

•CDETNO added strategic planning support for non-profit organizations to its services. Tools and templates have been developed and first requests have been drawn up.

-47 businesses and non-profit organizations have contacted the economic development officer to obtain counselling or recommendations regarding their business ideas.

Investment

CDETNO offers a range of customized, free and confidential services for francophone investors Contributing to the economic development of the Northwest Territories we open the communication channels between NWT Business and French-speaking markets

- •Online release of the NWT business directory in the mining sector. This website was created thanks to the NWT Mining Industry Value Chain Study in collaboration with NWT & Nunavut Chamber of Mines and the Department of Industry, Tourism and Investment (ITI). The website is available at **nwt-mining-invest.com**
- •Attendance at 3 major investment related events: Opportunities North in Yellowknife, Association for Mineral Exploration (AME) Round up in Vancouver and Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada (PDAC) in Toronto. In the later event two NWT businesses, Global Storm IT and Global Storm Technologie, accompanied CDETNO.
- •November 20th to the 25th, CDETNO hosted a delegation from Chibougamau (Québec) and presented its tourism and investment attraction strategies.

Recruitment

We support NWT employers in the recruitment and retention process by offering various services to members such as job posting at job fairs in Canada and abroad.

- •Participation in **8** job fairs, including Destination Canada, in Paris and Brussels. During the four day event, our team gave **13** presentations about living and working in the NWT. **11** job offers from **7** employers were advertised at the event. Several other job fairs were organised in the context of the pan territorial project *Viens Vivre En Grand*, in collaboration with our counterpart organizations in Yukon and Nunavut.
- •6 presentations on the job market and lifestyle in the NWT were given to students and graduating students of several universities.
- •37 employers met to support labour recruitment and 79 job offers published on our website.
- •2 Employment Cafés with 39 employers recruiting.

Travailleurs d'établissement dans les écoles (TEE) Settlement Workers in Schools Program (SWIS)

CDETNO helps job seekers, newcomers and immigrants to integrate the Northwest Territories labour market with free bilingual services.

- •Launch of the **Yellowknife Insider's Guide** in collaboration with The Edge. This is a bilingual guide with practical information about the city of Yellowknife for anyone interested in living and working there. Visit this online guide at **www.ykinsidersguide.ca**
- •12 newcomers moved to the NWT and benefited from our services.
- •225 participants at the Employment Cafés.
- •5 mock interviews in collaboration with the NWT Career Centre, including one with a hard of hearing person via IP Replay system.
- •3 employment workshops given to 3 grade 10 students at Allain St-Cyr School in Yellowknife.
- •Visit of the Thebacha Business Development Services and Aurora College in Fort Smith to promote our services in employment and recruitment of skilled workers.
- •Pursuit of the SWIS program in the NWT. This program supports adaptation and school integration for newcomers, students and their parents newly arrived in Canada.
- •Pursuit of the Local Immigration Partnership (LIP). The goal is to develop local partnerships in order to find durable solutions in response to the newcomers needs.

Tourism

CDETNO promotes tourist attractions of the Northwest

•Online release of the website of the Francophone Heritage, Cultural and Tourism Corridor of RDÉE Canada and its members, a Pan-Canadian project on the occasion of Canada 150, to promote Canadian francophonie. Content about local heritage sites and tourism operators were finalized by CDETNO and integrated to the website.

•Implementation of the francisation assistance program. CDETNO offers the translation of 2000 words and a \$300 credit to tourism operators who wish to have their promotional material translated into French. Members of the program are eligible to join the Corridor.

•10 persons found one of CDETNO's geocaches.





Dress to Impress - for job seekers

This program, funded by GNWT HSS antipoverty, provides job seekers with professional clothing to wear to upcoming job interviews and aims to decrease the initial cost of acquiring a working wardrobe. 32 jobseekers benefited from this program, 24 for safety footwear.

The NWT Career Centre, operated by CDETNO, offers quality career development services to job ready clients by providing job seekers with the necessary tools, resources and opportunities to find work. In February 2016, CDETNC and the NWT Career Centre moved into the same office
