The team and I are pleased to once again present a summary of our actions over the last fiscal year 2022-2023 in our main areas of activity: employment and skills development, settlement services for newcomers, attraction and retention of skilled labour, youth initiation to entrepreneurship, support for local entrepreneurs, investment attraction and tourism promotion of NWT.

Despite past and present challenges faced by our communities - notably the recent forest fires and related evacuation orders - the team persevered, maintaining all existing projects and adding on some more.

DESTINATION CANADA PARTICIPATION

Economic development and Innovation

CDÉTNO supports Francophone and Francophile entrepreneurs who wish to participate in the economic growth of the Northwest Territories by giving them support and tools such as creating a business plan, seeking investments, and networking opportunities.

- 67 meetings with 41 entrepreneurs were held to provide support for starting or expanding their businesses
- 5 hybrid webinars were offered free of charge to 76 participants
- 2 information sessions on the process of opening a daycare in the NWT

AFTSO strategic plan

The economic development officer and the director of the Association franco-ténoise du Sud et de l'Ouest worked closely together for 3 months on their strategic plan.



Circular Economy



The Northern Circular Economy pilot project was implemented by CDÉTNO from April 2022 to March 2023 to establish a network of organizations in the Northwest Territories. Its objective was to develop an initial certification system to increase understanding among organizations, business owners, and consumers about the sustainability and local impact of products sold and purchased.

The project saw significant progress when three new members were recruited to join the network in 2022. However, progress has since slowed down considerably.

Youth entrepreneurship

CDÉTNO has a unique entrepreneurship project offering NWT young residents a concrete and enriching entrepreneurial experience.

Recruitment

The immigration, recruitment and employability agent was essential help to us in our search for the French-speaking workforce. He helped us find French-speaking workers internationally, in the field of early childhood education. Since then, we have applied for 4 international visas to address the labour shortage in Yellowknife. He is always there to answer our questions and promote our job offers.

We support NWT employers in recruitment by offering various free services to member employers, such as job postings and representation at job fairs in Canada and internationally.

- 117 job offers posted on our website
- 61 one-on-one meetings with employers
- 40 employers informed about international recruitment
- 12 job fairs

LIAISON TOUR 2022

There were 113 registrations for the three territories and the province of Newfoundland and Labrador, regarding the Northwest Territories, 37 people, organizations, and businesses in person and 14 online.



During Destination Canada in Paris, Rabat, and online, 2,659 candidates received information, 1,113 in person and 1,546 virtually.



Employment and immigration

CDÉTNO helps job seekers, newcomers, and immigrants integrate into the NWT labour market by offering free bilingual services.

- 109 participants in the two café-emploi with 30 employers present
- **7** information sessions on employability were given to **662** participants in person
- 5,214 candidates have received information about the NWT in French

Welcome and Integration

CDÉTNO supports its immigrant clients in their economic and community integration with information and referral services to resources available in French and English.



Data for services in French

- 298 french-speaking individuals interacted with our services
- 30 french-speaking newcomers entered the NWT in Yellowknife, 13 PR and 17 TR
- One of our clients became a Canadian citizen on February 16, 2023
- 30 individual sessions, 8 family sessions, 15 establishment plans, 7 information sessions and webinars were offered

Pre-departure service

Two families arrived as part of the pre-departure service that we have been offering since August 2022 in collaboration with Accueil francophone du Manitoba and Connexions Francophones.

Welcome and Integration

Project " plateforme de maillage "

The networking platform project for recruitment in early childhood and education (PEE) ended in March 2023. It helped to obtain 2 job promises for a daycare. Immigration procedures are underway and future employees and their families could arrive in the NWT in fall 2023.

National Francophone Immigration Week

As part of National Francophone Immigration Week, an evening of tales and legends was organized on November 9, 2022, with the participation of 18 people, including 3 permanent residents and 2 temporary residents.

Meetings and conferences

CDÉTNO Welcome and Integration service took part in numerous meetings during the year, including the RIFTNO meeting and the RIFs forum in February 2023; the work/training day for PEE coordinators and RDÉE Canada managers in Ottawa on February 21, 2022; the annual prairie meeting in Winnipeg.

Welcome and Integration

Overall, permanent residents, refugees, temporary residents, and Canadian citizens benefited from our reception and integration services in English for the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

Data for services in French

- In total, 217 sessions were carried out:
 - 57 needs assessments and referrals (NARS)
 - 143 family sessions
 - 17 individual sessions
- 3 clients passed the Canadian citizenship exam

Tax clinic and CRA services

The tax clinic opened on March 1, 2023, and our volunteer partner prepared and submitted the tax returns of 27 clients. In addition to clients in Yellowknife, he has also processed returns for Alberta, New Brunswick, and the Yukon residents. We also brought together 08 people during the webinar on taxes and benefits from the Canada Revenue Agency on March 22, 2023.

SWIS Program

School Settlement Program (SWIS) provides free support and integration services in the school environment. We help students and their parents get involved in the community and integrate into the Canadian school system.

- 29 sessions were conducted, including 13 one-on-one meetings and 16 group information sessions
- A summer camping experience was offered to 6 young people from Yellowknife
- For Black History Month 2023, SWIS Program presented the life stories of eminent members of the Black community in Canada and around the world. A total of 20 presentations were given to 400 students across 2 Yellowknife school boards.
- From March 6 to 8, 2023, an entrepreneurship activity was organized for students at École Boréale in Hay River. As a result of this activity, 37 students were benefited.
- 16 families participated in the March 2022 outdoor activity


Tourism

CDÉTNO promotes the Northwest Territories' tourist attractions to the various francophone markets. During national and international trade shows and meetings, we distribute tourist information and promotional tools in French to make the NWT a must-see destination for Francophones and Francophiles.



- Our partnership with NWT Tourism (NWT Tourism) for the presence of French has been renewed and is as dynamic as ever.
 - o 223 publications and content were posted on NWT Spectacular's French social networks;
 - o Nearly 75 000 likes were received by the various publications during the year;
 - o 9 200 visits to the Spectacular NWT French Facebook page;
- Translation and updating of the content of the NWT tourist guide Les Spectaculaires TNO

The website's operation in French **Spectaculaire TNO** has been relaunched, and several articles from the original Spectacular NWT site have been translated.




Cumulative coverage of the Facebook page Spectaculaire TNO - 2022/2023 in blue vs. 2021/2022 in dark gray.

NWT Career Centre

The Northwest Territories Career Center continued its trend of increased service demand for its Employment Assistance Services in the North Slave region while expanding offerings, including a suite of Skills Training certifications, Career Coaching, and CDETNO's Youth Employment and Skills Strategy program.












